



## WAYS TO DONATE

### REPLANTING LIVES KITS: PARTNER WITH US TO MEET TANGIBLE NEEDS OF NEWLY ARRIVING REFUGEE FAMILIES!

Refugees often flee their homes at a moment's notice or come from crowded refugee camps. They arrive at SeaTac airport with few belongings, a difficult past and high hopes for the future. Kits provide the basic household items they need for their new start in a place of safety.

### BUILDING A KIT IMPACTS LIVES IN 4 EASY STEPS!

1. Pick a Replanting Lives Kit from the list.
2. Mobilize your small group, family, church, school or other group to collect as many of the listed items as you can.

*Note: Items may be used, but must be clean, in good condition and functional.*

3. Pack collected items in a sturdy box. (Large plastic bins work well and will be reused by refugee families.) If possible print off the kit type and check off the items you were able to gather.

## REPLANTING LIVES KITS

### Kitchen Kit

- Fork, knife and spoon –a place setting of 4
- Plate, bowl and cup –a place setting of 4
- Basic pots, pans and baking pans
- Mixing/Serving bowls
- Cooking utensils
- Manual can opener
- Measuring spoons and measuring cups
- Kitchen knife
- Cutting board
- Kitchen towels, dish cloths or sponges
- 2 Rolls of paper towels

### Household Kit

- Washcloths, hand towel and bath towel
- Bed linens – 2 twin and 1 full sized
- Blanket – 2 twin and 1 full sized
- 4 bed pillows
- Alarm clock/radio
- Light bulbs – 2 packs of 4 bulbs
- Paper/Notepad
- Pens & pencils
- Hangers
- Box of envelopes

### Bathroom Kit

- 4 Rolls of toilet paper
- 2 Bottles of shampoo
- 8 Bars of soap
- 4 Toothbrushes
- 2 Tubes of toothpaste
- Box of feminine products
- Deodorant (men's & women's)
- Disposable razors
- Nail clippers
- Hand/Body lotion
- Band-aids
- Cotton balls
- Shaving cream
- Hairbrush/Comb
- Box of tissues
- Shower curtain w/hooks

### Cleaning Supply Kit

- Bottle of dish detergent
- Bathroom/Kitchen cleanser
- Waste paper basket
- Box of tall trash bags
- Sponges or cloths for cleaning
- Paper towels
- Toilet brush
- Laundry detergent

### Child Supply Kit

- Backpack
- Pens, pencils and erasers
- Crayons and coloring book
- Notebooks
- Small toys or stuffed animals

### Baby Supply Kit

- Diaper bag
- New Infant/Child car seat
- Diapers and wet wipes
- Bottles and a pacifier
- Burping cloths
- Baby powder
- Baby shampoo
- Rattle
- Baby blanket



## DONATIONS NEEDS: FURNITURE AND HOUSEHOLD ITEMS

- Twin, Full or Queen mattresses/box springs (good condition)
- Frames for twin, double, queen beds—If simple and easy to assemble
- Dressers/chests of drawers
- Kitchen/dining tables with chairs
- Bunk beds and cribs—If simple and with all bolts included
- Metro bus tickets
- Vehicles in good running condition for refugee families in need of transportation
- Bicycles
- Gift cards to stores such as Safeway, Fred Meyer, or Target
- TV's—relatively new, working color sets only
- DVD players
- Microwaves—relatively new, working
- Vacuums
- Couches—no stains, tears or animal hair
- Coffee/End tables
- Lamps
- Armchairs
- Computers—newer models with an operating system and basic software

### DONATIONS WE ARE NOT ABLE TO ACCEPT:

- Food
- Sofa beds
- King size beds/mattresses
- Large appliances (fridges, stoves, etc.)
- Damaged, stained or unusable items
- Anything that needs to be repaired
- Mattresses that are stained, torn.

### DONATING CLOTHING FOR GOODWILL:

Organizing a donation drive of good-quality second-hand clothes and shoes is a great way to help World Relief provide needed clothing to refugees in a way that is fun and empowering. The items you gather may be donated to Seattle Goodwill on behalf of World Relief. In turn, Goodwill issues vouchers that refugees can use to shop for needed items at local Goodwill stores. Advanced arrangements and special procedures are necessary to be sure your donations get counted for World Relief!
